### **Lessons of the Revolution - HISTORY**

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Core Knowledge. The American Revolution focuses on the disagreements about principles of government which led the colonists in North America to seek independence from Great Britain. The causes, major figures, and consequences of the American Revolution provide a framework for understanding what caused the colonies to break away and become an independent nation, and what significant ideas and values were at the heart of the American Revolution.

American Revolution, also called United States War of Independence or American Revolutionary War, (1775–83), insurrection by which 13 of Great Britain 's North American colonies won political independence and went on to form the United States of America.

### **Master Teacher Lesson Plans - The American Revolution ...**
